No limitation for sexual assault if victim files a written report during the period of limitation prescribed in § 171.085 and § 171.095;2. § 171.085: Sexual assault must be found, or an information or complaint filed, within twenty years after commission of the offense; or3. § 171.095: If sexual abuse against a child, before the victim is 36 if victim discovers or reasonably should have discovered that she/he was a victim of sexual abuse by the date she/he reaches 36; or before the victim is 43 if she/he does not discover and reasonably should not have discovered that she/he was a victim of the sexual abuse by the date she/he reached 36.

Exceptions	<p>If the identity of a person who is accused of committing a sexual assault is established by conducting a genetic marker analysis of a biological specimen and obtaining a DNA profile, the period of limitation prescribed in NRS 171.085 is removed and there is no limitation of the time within which a prosecution for the sexual assault must be commenced.</p> <p>N.R.S. 171.082. Identify of person committing a sexual assault established by biological specimen; period of limitation for prosecution.</p>

Stat. § 171.095: If any indictment found, or an information or complaint filed, within the time prescribed in subsection 1 (offenses committed in secret manner and offenses constituting sexual abuse of a child) is defective so that no judgment can be given thereon, another prosecution may be instituted for the same offense within 6 months after the first is abandoned.• § 171.083: If a victim of a sexual assault or sex trafficking is under a disability during any part of the period of limitation prescribed in §§ 171.085 and 171.095 and a written report concerning the sexual assault or sex trafficking is not otherwise filed pursuant to subsection 1 of § 171.083, the period during which the victim is under the disability must be excluded from any calculation of the period of limitation prescribed in §§ 171.085 and 171.095.• Civil Actions:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Nev. Rev. Stat. § 11.215 Actions for damages for injury arising from sexual abuse of minor; exception for actions involving injury arising from appearance of minor in pornography. Action to recover damages for an injury to a person arising from the sexual abuse of the plaintiff which occurred when the plaintiff was less than 18 years of age must be commenced within 20 years after the plaintiff (a) reaches 18 years of age; or (b) discovers or reasonably should have discovered that his or her injury was caused by the sexual abuse, whichever occurs later.
